



# HILLSIDE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

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Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year! Our faculty and staff join me in extending a very special welcome to our new Hillside families. We are excited to embark on this educational journey with you and your family and look forward to wonderful years together!

This year, school begins on Tuesday, September 3<sup>rd</sup>. As always, parents may drop children off when our supervision begins at 7:50 AM. **Please do not drop students off before this time, as there is no supervision available.** All students, K-4, are expected to arrive no later than our start time of 8:30 AM. For the first few days of school, we will meet our kindergarten students in the school library to ease them into our routines. Please feel free to walk your kindergarten student to the library; however, we encourage you to not linger, as prolonged goodbyes can be difficult for our youngsters. Know that we have skilled staff on hand to support our children in this special transition.

We have a wonderful year of learning ahead of us! Our five-year Balanced Literacy initiative will be entering its third year of implementation. We have successfully rolled out our Reading Units of Study, complete with Reader's Workshop, Interactive Read Aloud, Guided Reading, Shared Reading, Reading Conferences and Strategy Groups. All of our teachers have been trained around best practices in balanced literacy with a focus on reading. This year, our teachers will be working to roll out our Writer's Workshop. The philosophy of Writer's Workshop aligns with our vision for all students' learning to be individualized, meeting them in their zone of proximal development. All grades, K-4, will be implementing new Writing Units of Study to support the growth of our blossoming writers. We encourage your partnership at home by orally recounting stories of memorable events, milestones or experiences that your child has had, which your child can then tell in written form. We look forward to sparking the joy of writing in our entire community!

This past school year, we purchased hundreds of diverse texts for our classroom and school libraries in order to provide windows (where students learn about others in our community and the world) and mirrors (where students see themselves) in texts. We focused on the lenses of race and culture, gender and learning difference, infusing a wide array of books into our literacy curriculum. This school year, we will be advancing our Diverse Book work to continue our vision of ensuring that Hillside is an equitable environment for all. Building upon our collection of diverse texts at Hillside, teachers will be supporting student conversations during multicultural interactive read alouds on racial and social justice. We are committed to developing student understanding of the diverse world in which we live.

In our prioritization of the whole child, we have worked diligently over the past two years to improve social-emotional learning at Hillside. After rolling out our Second Step curriculum for all students, we added tiered individual and group counseling support for youngsters. Our Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) team worked collaboratively toward communicating clear expectations for many of our shared spaces at Hillside, teaching into the expectations and providing signage as reminders for all (Thank you to HEF for our AMAZING poster maker!). This year, we will be implementing a school-wide recognition program to celebrate positive behaviors at Hillside furthering our promotion of our core values of Respect, Courage and Curiosity.

Thanks to Sadie Ratcliffe, incoming third grader here at Hillside, we will be welcoming students back to school with a new theme:

*Just like paints on a palette, we all make the picture complete!*

This theme will be woven throughout the school experience- our birthday photo booth, special events, assemblies and even Field Day! We anticipate a colorful year!

In an effort to ensure that all parents receive our [Summer Mailing](#) regardless of location, we have again put it online on our webpage. We have worked together with our PTSA to ensure safer arrival and dismissal procedures at Hillside and will continue to review and improve our systems. Additionally, your child will receive a letter from his/her teacher before school begins welcoming him/her to the new classroom. We appreciate your patience and understanding.
